It is a combination car show and street festival. There were several hundred cars, mostly 50's and 60's American cars, mostly high performance or modified. Ford's were prominent as is the tradition here I guess. (some might remember "Awesome Bill (Elliott) from Dawsonville" and his super fast Nascar T Bird.) A special section of Fords included numerous "R" code 427 Galaxies and rare SOHC 427s stuffed in '56 Fords. 
